This year the event will be held entirely in English, as many guests from abroad will be attending. The lectures will be given by Benjamin White, prof. dr. sc. Ivana Kunda, prof. dr. Iza Rezija, prof. dr. Neda Zdravova, prof. dr. Dušan V. Popović, Paul Keller and univ. ass. dr. Žiga Škorjanc.

In June this year, the KR21 Research Network for the Western Balkans was established as part of the Knowledge Rights 21 project. The first research work was in the area of copyright exceptions for data and text mining. The event will address this specific exception, which constitutes the legal basis for data analytics, as well as the general exception for research, which was introduced in the EU by the Infosoc Directive 2001/29/EC in 2001, but implemented in Slovenia only last year with the amendment of the copyright legislation. In the last part of the presentation, MSc. Dunja Legat will present the topic of open science as it is practiced in Slovenia in accordance with the strategy and legislation in this area. Guests from the Western Balkan countries will present the activities in this area in Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, North Macedonia and Serbia.

As part of the Open Knowledge Day, we are organizing a special workshop for researchers from the KR21 Researchers Network for the Western Balkans, which will take place on **18 October 2023** at the Museum of Contemporary Art, Maistrova 3, 1000 Ljubljana (+MSUM).

The workshop will discuss in more detail the issues of copyright management and open data in line with the principles of open science. We will focus on the obligation of authors to manage their copyrights in accordance with the principles of open science, which means the possibility to retain their rights. We will also examine the specific legal regime that addresses the presumption of authors' reservation of secondary publication rights. In the second part, we will discuss the research in the field of data and text mining that is being carried out in the framework of the KR21 Researchers' Network for the Western Balkans.

We invite representatives of research and educational institutions from Slovenia to join our workshop. The event will be held live only and will not be available online.
